


Jir John Nisbet Lord Dirleton 1610-1688

John Nisbet was named a Lord of Tession on the 1st of November 1636, was knighted by the Marguis of Hamilton, as royal commissioner, on the 14th of November 1638 and was sheriff-depute of the county of Edinburgh in 1639. He was admitted as King Charles the 1st's advocate on the 20th of November 1663, He purchased Dirleton Castle in 1663 and rather than rebuild the ruined Castle he built Archerfield as his home. Apparently none of his children survived as he left Archerfield to his second cousin, Jir William Nisbet, the son of Jir Alexander Nisbet.
